English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)

ESOL Levels 1, 2, 2/3, 3, 4/5, 6

In-person and online options

Our ESOL core classes focus on the ability to listen, speak, read, write, use math, think critically and creatively, and use technology to navigate our lives. Each class is content- or theme-based, and skills are taught in context. Each class also works towards a final, integrated-skills project.

Citizenship Class

ESOL Level: 2-4

In-person and online options

This year-long content-based ESOL course prepares students to pass the US naturalization exam. Regular literacy lessons develop reading skills and focus on the civics and history content of the 100 questions. Students also practice sentence level dictation and sight word spelling. Listening and speaking prepares students to participate in academic discussions, presentations, and formal interview situations. Citizenship students will need to do an intake, sign an information sharing consent form, share a copy of their green card, and share a copy of benefits or income evidence.

Beginning Computer Class

ESOL Level: 2+

In-Person only

This class prepares beginners with little or no computer experience, as well as students interested in expanding their digital literacy, with transferable computer skills necessary for their personal, work and educational lives. Basic Computer Skills Class focuses on basic student email, Google Classroom, online assignment, and Zoom skills that are needed for success in Literacy Source classes. Each quarter curriculum will remain largely the same with the expectation that returning students will be reviewing or practicing these core digital literacy skills for use in concurrent and future classes. This class is suitable for ESOL level 2+ students, and high level 1 students with instructor permission. Students must be able to read sight words, have taken at least 1 quarter of ESOL 1 or be concurrently enrolled in ESOL 1 or higher to enroll in class.

Conversation

ESOL Level: 2-6

In-person and online options

In whole-class and small-groups, students practice conversation around a variety of daily life topics. Class focuses on speaking and listening skills.

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Literacy Source — Class Descriptions

Ready to Work

ESOL 3-4

Online Only

Ready to Work is a job-skills ESOL class that teaches reading, writing, listening, speaking, math and digital literacy in workplace contexts. The class is 4 days per week and has a required independent work component. Employment case management support is provided for participants. Students must live in the city of Seattle and be interested in finding a new or better job. In addition to the Literacy Source hosted class, which is all online, hybrid options are offered through our partners at ACRS and Neighborhood House High Point.

GED Math Lab

Online only

In GED Math Lab, students are able to work independently, with tutor support, on their next specific math goals. Students can practice any level of math they need to improve their lives or work toward a credential from addition to pre-calc. Students may attend regularly, 2 days a week, or work at least 4 hours a week independently and attend 1 day a week as a distance learning student.

Reading and Writing for GED

ABE Level 4-5 and ESOL Level 6

Online Only

This class focuses on developing writing composition, both learning the structure of writing and telling a story in your own voice. Content reading lessons serve as a basis for critical thinking and writing in different genres including summaries, narratives, chronology, cause and effect, and persuasive writing. The objective is to expand contexts so that students can read and write fluently, moving towards more academic reading and writing skills. Students who need continued support in spelling and decoding may have a tutor to support their class work.

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Literacy Source — Tutoring Program Descriptions

Tutoring is offered to support students enrolled in our ESOL, GED, and Citizenship classes.

Tutoring is once a week for as little as 90 minutes and up to 2 hours long.

Offered online or in-person.

Available to students registered in Literacy Source classes.

Additional Tutoring Programs for Students:

Adult Foundational Skills Tutoring

ABE Level: 1-3

In-person only

Work 1:1 with a tutor for reading, writing, math, or digital skills/computers. Three hours/week. *Co-enrollment in another Literacy Source class is not required for this tutoring program.*

Work Skills Tutoring

ESOL and ABE Level 3+

Online or In-person options

Tutors can meet with students for 10 weeks.

The Work Skills tutoring program at Literacy Source focuses on one of the 3 goals:

- Resume: writing and sending
- Job applications: filling out and sending
- Job interviews: practice language and content for in-person or on-line interviews

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
